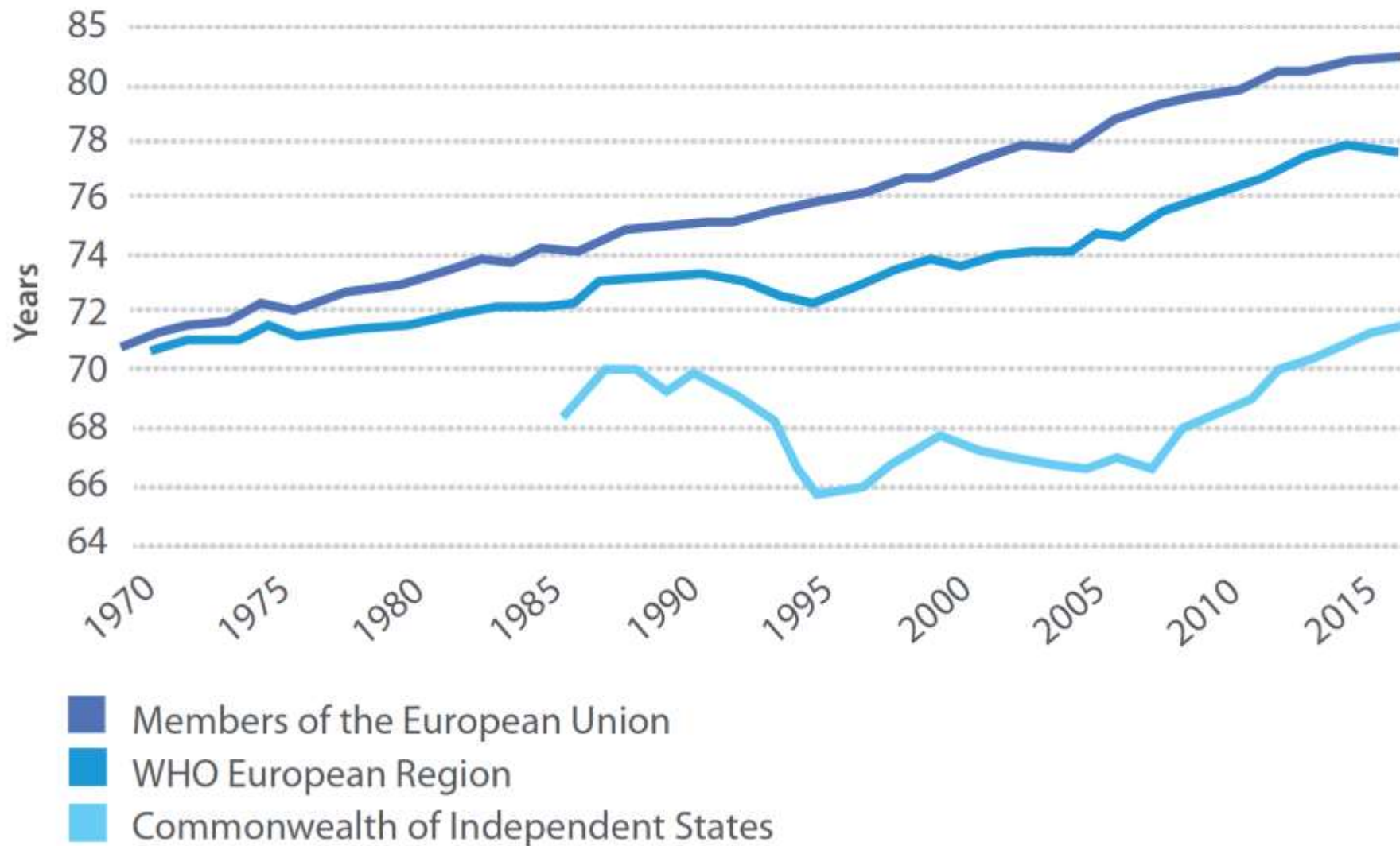

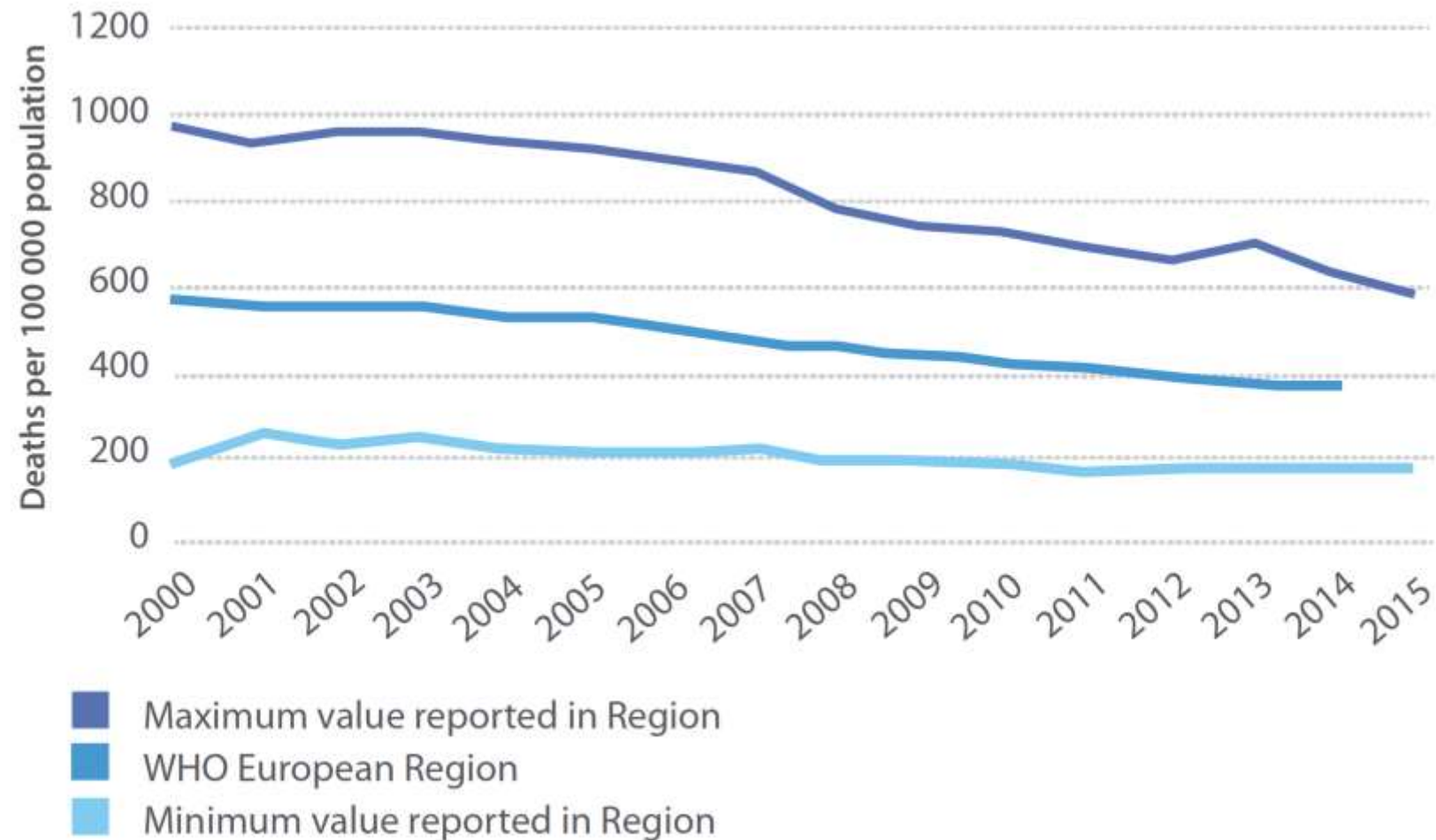

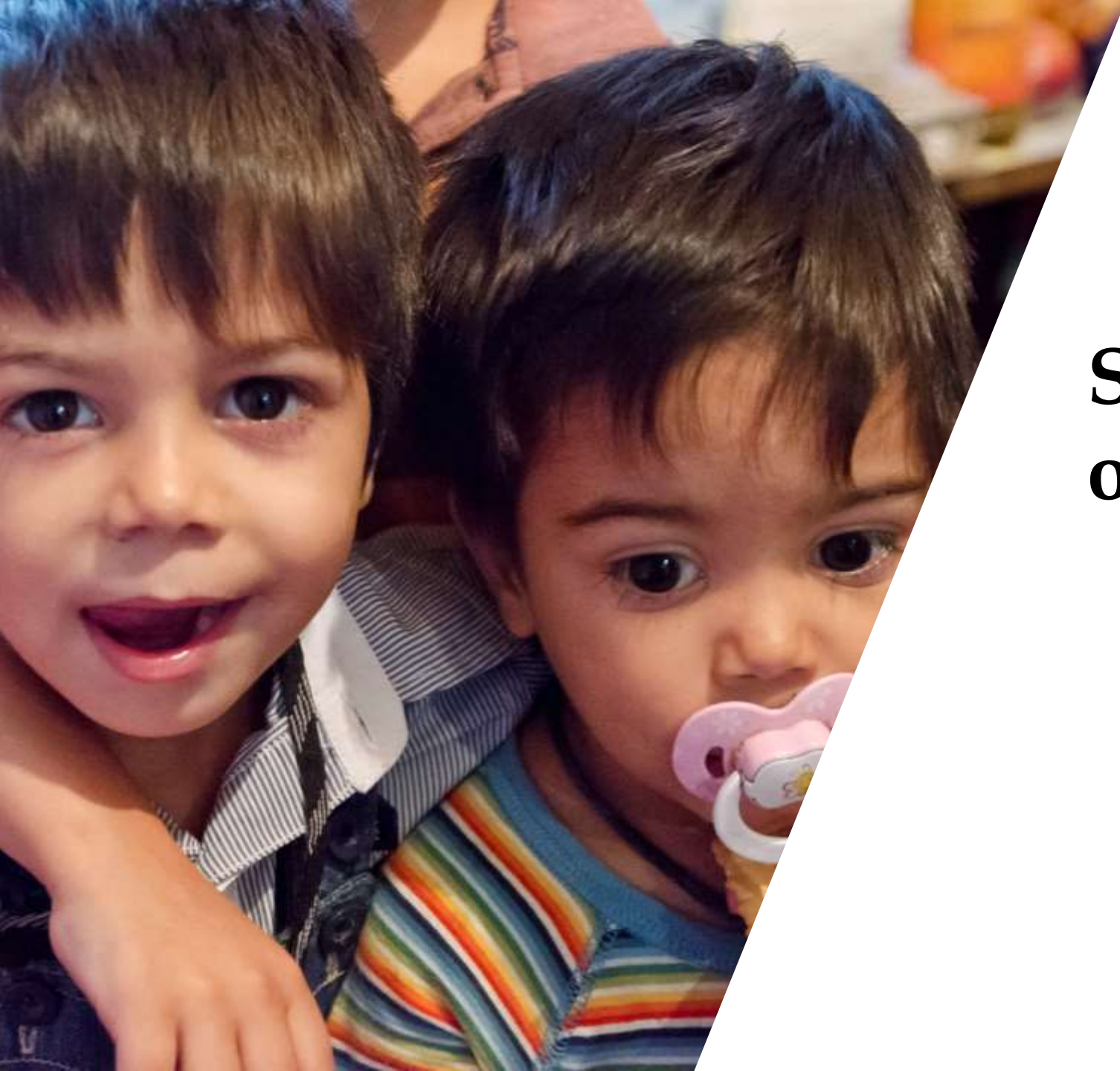

5. Therefore we, the Member States and partners, believe² that:

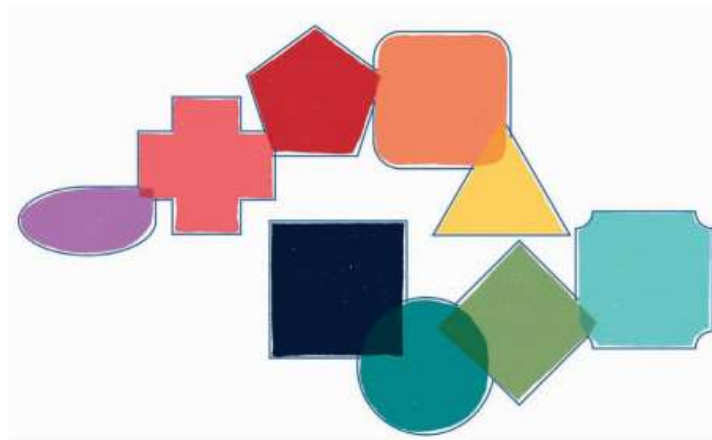

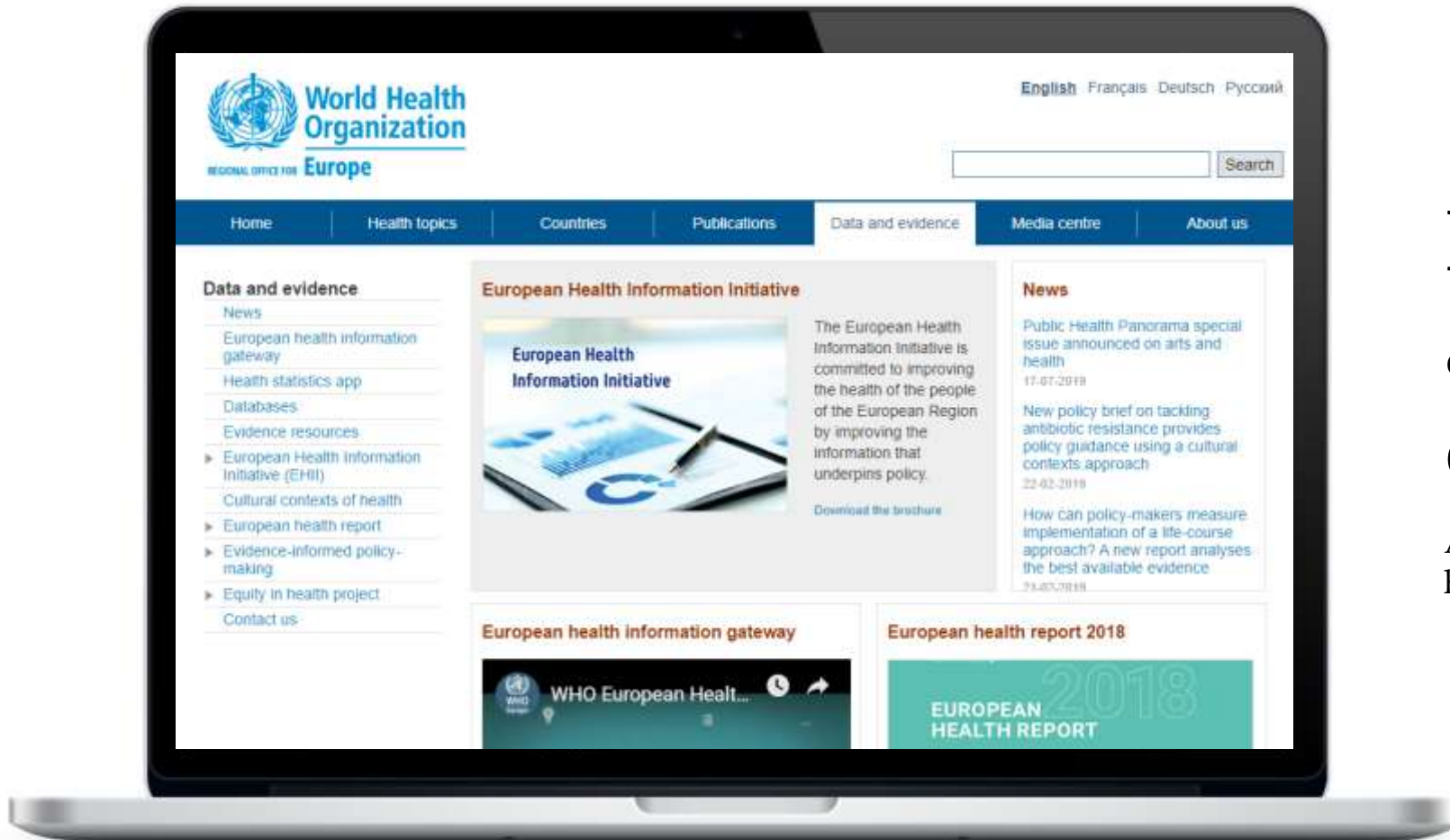

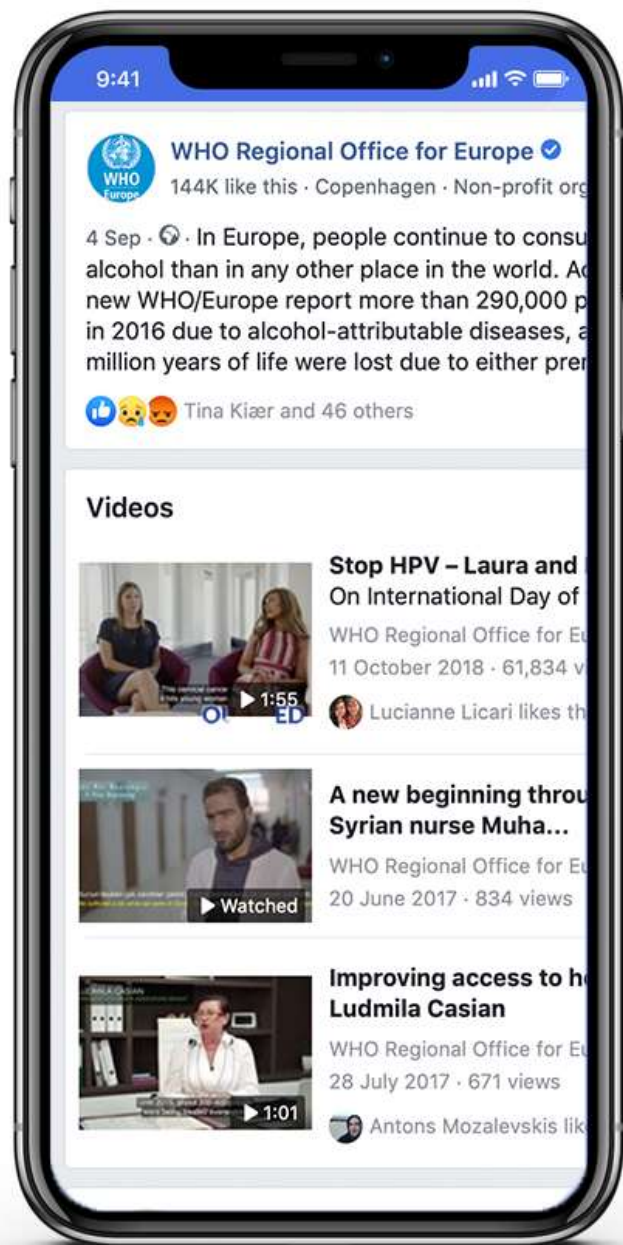
