












Five interdependent strategic directions

One roadmap


The WHO European Region has made significant progress towards better health and well-being.





## Financing





Domestic resource mobilization and distribution – SDG financing relies on national budgets.

Financing for sustainable development – rarely integrated into annual budget cycles.

Foreign direct investment – largest source of external finance in some eastern European countries.

Development assistance – has shown little increase in recent years – few European countries benefitting.




