

KEY FACTS ON HIV EPIDEMIC IN MONACO AND PROGRESS IN 2011

(pop. 35 352)

Monaco did not report any data on HIV/AIDS cases and deaths among AIDS cases to the WHO Regional Office for Europe and the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC). However, in their country progress report 2010, Monaco reports by December 2009 a cumulative total of 71 HIV cases since the beginning of the epidemic (latest data available).

By December 2009, 32 people are known to be living with HIV. Of these cases, 11 cases (34%) were infected through sex between men, 9 cases (28%) through heterosexual contact, 11 cases (34%) through injecting drug use and 1 case (3%) through mother-to-child transmission.

By the end of 2005 (latest data available), 45 people living with HIV in Monaco were receiving antiretroviral therapy.
