Over 84000 people die from road traffic injuries every year. cyclists and motorcyclists. That's about **230 people** every day.

390 of all road traffic deaths are among pedestrians,

The risk of dying in a road crash in low- and middle-income countries is

1.4 times higher


than that in high-income countries.

Although low- and middle-income countries have fewer vehicles, they have higher fatality rates from road traffic injuries than high-income countries.
