

## HEN Report Uptake Summary

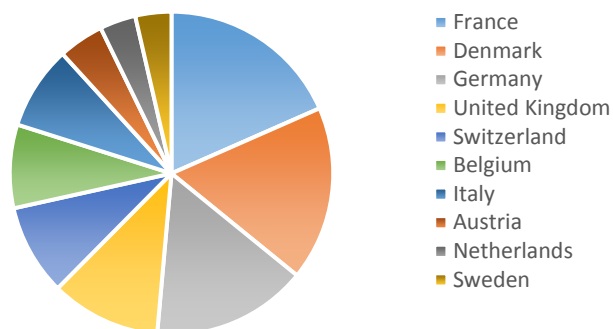
