

Clustering of Essential Public Health Operations (EPHOs) - to deliver Public Health services

VISION: Sustainable Health & Well-Being





The Resolution - the key elements

- 1. Take forward the European Action Plan as a pillar for implementing Health 2020
- 2. The Essential Public Health Operations and avenues for action
- 3. The self assessment of EPHOs as a tool to assist development of country strategies and action plan, implementing the EAP jointly with member states
- 4. Member states to collaborate in implementing the European Action Plan
- 5. The Regional Director to provide leadership in public health, develop partnerships, produce a report on self assessments, and develop a dynamic approach to implementing the EPHOs



The European Action Plan for Strengthening Public Health: Next Steps

- The implementation period for the EAP will be from **2012–2020**.
- Continued consultation and engagement with member states
- Expert and Working groups will be created to implement the European Action Plan
- A governance structure will be established with a steering group
- Progress will be reported to the Regional Committee
