### Slovakia moves towards TB elimination

### 11–14 March 2013

After successfully reducing the tuberculosis rate to 6.4 cases per 100 000 population, Slovakia is now moving into the elimination phase. WHO/Europe and the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) therefore conducted a joint review of existing policies and plans for tuberculosis (TB) elimination in the country.

#### Belarus applies for funding to further strengthen its TB control programme

#### 1 March 2013

Belarus has submitted a funding renewal application to the Global Fund for continued collaboration with WHO/Europe in strengthening the national TB control programme.

# COUNTRY IN FOCUS: KYRGYZSTAN

Kyrgyzstan is among the 27 high multidrug-resistant (MDR) TB burden countries in the world. Adherence to MDR-TB treatment is a challenge, and monitoring and evaluation of drug-resistant TB cases needs to be improved. The country has a low MDR-TB detection rate because of limited laboratory capacity.

Substantial financial gaps exist, especially with regard to the complex and costly interventions of drugresistant TB management. About 44% of funds for TB control activities are contributed by foreign aid, including the Global Fund, making Kyrgyzstan dependent on external support and threatening sustainable TB interventions. <u>WHO evaluates tuberculosis control programme in Kyrgyzstan</u> Tuberculosis country work summary: "<u>Kyrgyzstan</u>"

#### Progress of implementation of concerted action plans to prevent and combat M/XDR-TB

12th WHO National TB Programme Managers' Meeting and 16th Wolfheze Workshops, jointly organized by WHO/Europe, ECDC and KNCV Tuberculosis Foundation. Provisional programme now available. 29–31 May 2013, The Hague, Netherlands

Workshop on coordinating tuberculosis control in Romania

19–21 March 2013

The Romanian ministries of health and defence are conducting this workshop together with the United States European Command (USEUCOM), Armed Forces Health Surveillance Center (AFHSC) and Embassy in Bucharest. The workshop focuses on treatment protocols, infection control best practices, social support for TB patients and TB surveillance programmes.

Roundtable discussion on implementing national PAL in Belarus 9 April 2013

Members of the national working group on Practical Approach to Lung Health (PAL) and international experts will discuss the results of the piloting phase of a WHO-supported PAL project in Ostrovetz district (Grodno region) and will finalize national PAL guidelines before a country-wide roll out. The WHO/Europe-facilitated roundtable is funded through the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) grant "Enhancement of the STOP TB strategy in Belarus, 2010–2013".

7th meeting of the Technical Advisory Group on Tuberculosis Control (TAG-TB) 3 December 2012, Copenhagen, Denmark

TAG-TB provides advice to the WHO Regional Office for Europe on strategic directions and specific technical areas related to TB prevention, control and care. The objectives of the December 2012 meeting were to review progress and discuss and propose specific measures to improve TB surveillance, introduction of new medicines, drug management and supply and cross-border TB control in the WHO European Region.
