UZBEKISTAN Major steps towards better health

Political commitment at the highest level



- Presidential and State health programmes
 - 50% of the national budget each year dedicated to social development
 - many "Presidential Annual Themes" related to health
 - adoption of a broader "whole government" approach to health
 - focusing on links between health, health systems and social determinants of health
 - addressing both communicable and non communicable diseases
- Child Rights Convention ratified

- Health system reform;
 - strengthened primary health care services
 - guaranteed package free of charge
 - efficient referral system
 - improved quality of care
 - updated legislation
 - strengthened human resources for health
- Scaling up evidence-based national policies and strategic plans for disease prevention, health promotion and care



Estimated average maternal mortality ratio








- Patient-centred health facilities renovated and fully equipped

















