Health workers are the heart and soul of health systems. And yet, the world is faced with a chronic shortage. A new progress report under the title *A universal truth: no health without a workforce* (2013) estimates a global shortage of 7.2

million health workers, with 83 countries facing a health worker crisis.

The relative shortages of doctors, nurses and midwives are still most acute in sub-Saharan Africa. This is currently one of the major obstacles to achieving the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and other international health goals, including universal health coverage.
