Web consultation of Member States: main comments

There was general agreement that development of the plan to improve preparedness and responsiveness of the public health sector is urgent and timely.

- The plan is comprehensive, covering important issues for strengthening preparedness; it provides strategic guidance at the national level.
- The importance of aligning the plan with ongoing subregional preparedness planning efforts and frameworks for example at EU level was noted.
- The challenge will be to ensure financial and political commitment to implementation of all proposals – in particular, collaboration with non-health sectors.



Rationale for the action plan

To ensure "high-level political and financial commitment to address the full cycle of emergency management, including prevention, preparedness, response and recovery, supported by multisectoral engagement, whole-of-society approaches and effective partnerships"






