Professor David Salisbury, Chair

Professor Salisbury is a paediatrician and currently Associate Fellow, Centre on Global Health Security, Royal Institute of International Affairs, Chatham House, London and Chair of the Board of the Jenner Vaccine Foundation. He serves as Chair of both the RCC and the Global Commission for Certification of Poliomyelitis Eradication. He was formerly head of immunization at the Department of Health, London, head of England's national immunization programme, inaugural President of the International Association of Immunization Managers and Chair of the WHO Strategic Advisory Group of Experts on Vaccines. He has also co-chaired a G7 working group on pandemic influenza.



Dr Donato Greco

Dr Greco is a medical doctor specialized in communicable disease, hygiene and public health, epidemiology and medical biostatistics and is currently senior research fellow of IPRI Lion. He has served as national epidemiologist and director of the laboratory of epidemiology and biostatistics in the National Institute of Health (ISS), Italy and Director General of prevention at the Ministry of Health. He is the former director of the WHO collaborating centre for communicable disease and has worked with the European Union as expert evaluator of research projects and as a consultant for the European Center for Disease Control.



Professor Tapani Hovi

Professor Hovi is a virologist and the former head of the WHO Collaborative Center/Polio at the National Institute for Health and Welfare (THL), Helsinki, Finland. Dr Tapani Hovi has been involved in research and surveillance of poliovirus infections since 1984. He has authored and co-authored multiple peer-reviewed scientific papers and presented works at many national and International conferences. Dr Tapani Hovi is actively associated with different societies and academies





Ellyn W. Ogden, MPH

Ms Ogden has been the Worldwide Polio Eradication Coordinator and Technical Director for the US Agency for International Development (USAID) and a Senior Technical Advisor for Health and Child Survival since 1997. Ms Ogden has further served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Papua New Guinea and a John's Hopkins University Health and Child Survival Fellow with USAID's Latin America Bureau. In 2009, Ms. Ogden received USAID's Award for Heroism for her successful efforts to negotiate "Ceasefires and Days of Tranquility" in several conflict countries in Africa and Asia. She is also the recipient of Rotary International's prestigious "Paul Harris Fellows Award" for Humanitarian Service.



Dr Rudolf Tangermann

Dr Tangermann is a paediatrician and epidemiologist, formerly senior WHO staff member working with the Polio Eradication Initiative. He also formerly held positions with the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the WHO Western Pacific Regional Office (WPRO) in Manila, Philippines. For more than 20 years he has worked on polio eradication and immunization issues at the global level, with emphasis on assisting with implementation of polio eradication field strategies (supplementary immunization campaigns, disease surveillance) in Pakistan and Afghanistan, and on maintaining and further improving poliovirus surveillance at the global level.



Dr Anton M van Loon

Dr van Loon is a virologist and former head of the Department of Clinical Virology at the University Medical Centre Utrecht, the Netherlands, and head of the Laboratory of Virology at RIVM, the Dutch national public health institute. He was involved with the Global Polio Eradication Initiative since its start in 1988 and stood at the basis of the Global Polio Laboratory Network (GPLN). In 2001, he founded Quality Control for Molecular Diagnostics, a not-for-profit organization for the international quality assessment of molecular diagnosis in laboratory medicine.
