#### Membership of WHO bodies and committees

#### **European Environment and Health Committee**

The Fourth Ministerial Conference on Environment and Health, held in Budapest from 23 to 25 June 2004, agreed, through its Declaration (document EUR/04/5046267/6) to extend the mandate of the European Environment and Health Committee (EEHC) by another five years until the next conference in 2009, according to the terms of reference and membership as outlined in *The future of the Environment and Health process in Europe* (document EUR/04/5046267/9) and reproduced in the attached paper. The Budapest Conference also agreed that the WHO Regional Committee for Europe should appoint five country representatives.

By letter of 30 April 2004 the Regional Director invited Member States to submit nominations for membership of the EEHC by 30 June 2004. This document contains the curricula vitae of candidates nominated by the governments of Armenia, Bulgaria, Cyprus, France, Norway, Portugal and the Russian Federation that were received at the Regional Office by that date.

The Regional Committee is therefore requested to select five members of the EEHC as representative of the health sector.

#### Terms of reference

- 1. The Budapest Conference, through its Declaration (document EUR/04/5046267/6), adopted the following terms of reference for the new European Environment and Health Committee (EEHC):
- To oversee coordination and implementation of the outcomes of the European Environment and Health process (for example, the Children's Environment and Health Action Plan for Europe), taking into account other relevant processes and programmes, and to help promote and ensure reporting back on the implementation of actions decided by the Budapest Ministerial Conference.
- To foster the exchange and dissemination of information among relevant actors in the field of environment and health and to propose regional activities, encouraging the involvement of all Member States in the Region as well as other relevant stakeholders, thereby increasing interest in the Environment and Health process.
- To promote cooperation and coordination with associated organizations and related processes, and
  in particular the links between the Environment and Health process, the Environment for Europe
  process and the European Commission's Environment and Health Strategy, taking into account the
  recommendations of the Rio Declaration, Agenda 21 and the World Summit on Sustainable
  Development.
- To assist in identifying environmental health issues that require collaborative action or further study, including the possible promotion of subregional activities, and to make recommendations for further action to the WHO Regional Office for Europe (including its related bodies such as the Regional Committee and the Standing Committee of the Regional Committee), as well as to other appropriate organizations/bodies.
- To further develop the Environment and Health process in Europe by facilitating and promoting partnerships with relevant stakeholders and intersectorality in the field of environment and health that lead to sustainability.
- To report annually to the WHO Regional Committee for Europe and to the UNECE Committee on Environmental Policy on achievements and areas needing greater efforts, as well as on the Committee's activities, work plan and financial requirements.
- To provide all Member States in 2007, through the WHO Regional Committee for Europe and the UNECE Committee on Environmental Policy, with a detailed proposal for the agenda of the Fifth Ministerial Conference on Environment and Health in 2009.

#### Composition

- 2. The composition of the new EEHC consists of representatives of the following bodies and sectors:
- Ten Member States from the European Region of WHO (five health representatives and five environment representatives);
- European Commission (Directorate-General for Health and Consumer Protection, and Directorate-General for the Environment);
- European Environment Agency;
- United Nations Economic Commission for Europe;
- United Nations Environment Programme;
- Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development;
- World Health Organization, also serving as secretariat;
- The Regional Environmental Centre for central and eastern Europe;

- Two nongovernmental organizations one representing the health sector and one representing the environment sector;
- Business World Business Council for Sustainable Development;
- Trade unions International Confederation of Free Trade Unions;
- One youth representative.

#### Term of office

3. As recommended by the Budapest Conference, the members of the EEHC should be elected to serve up to the midterm review in 2007, at which time new elections should be held for representatives to serve up to the Fifth Ministerial Conference on Environment and Health in 2009. However, it is foreseen that in the future the Committee may wish to recommend an extension of its term of office following the midterm review, to allow continuity in preparations for the Fifth Ministerial Conference.
