

# 11<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF THE HEPA EUROPE STEERING COMMITTEE ROME, ITALY, 20-21 APRIL 2009

## **Executive summary**

### 1. Background

The 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Steering Committee of HEPA Europe was convened to review the implementation of the 2008/2009 work programme and to update on recent developments. In addition, the discussion on management and interaction with members and partners were continued and preparations of the 5<sup>th</sup> annual meeting in November 2009 were discussed. Also, the applications for membership received from January to March 2009 were assessed and decided upon.

The meeting was attended by 7 members of the Steering Committee (see Annex). It was chaired by Brian Martin from the Swiss Federal Office of Sport (BASPO) and hosted and assisted by the WHO European Centre for Environment and Health, Rome office.

## 2. Management and interaction with partners and members

The first part of the meeting was dedicated to follow-up the development of a strategy for a more proactive management and interaction with partners and members, started at the last meeting. The discussion was kicked off by summarizing the previous discussion. Participants discussed the proposal to start the designation process in view of the possible establishment of a new WHO Collaborating Centre on Physical Activity and Health. Such a Centre might be established at the University of Zurich and the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology ETH, under the lead of Brian Martin and in collaboration with the Federal Offices for Sport and for Public Health as well as other national institutions. As part of its terms of reference and work-plan, the Centre could take up a supportive role for the management of HEPA Europe, by hosting its secretariat in close coordination and cooperation with the WHO Regional Office for Europe. An initial discussion took place on the possible implications of such a centre with regard to HEPA Europe. The discussion will be continued at the next meeting.

### 2. Evaluation of applications for membership

2 new applications were assessed and supported by the Steering Committee. The applicants will become temporary members and will be proposed to the network for confirmation at the next annual meeting.

#### 3. Annual meetings of HEPA Europe

The preparations of the 5<sup>th</sup> annual meeting, hosted by the Public Health Service of the Emilia Romagna Region on 11-12 November 2009, were presented and discussed, including the programme structure. The meeting will include a half-day symposium on "Perceptions of the urban environment and physical activity", meetings of the HEPA Europe working groups and the annual meeting of HEPA members.

The 6<sup>th</sup> annual meeting, to take place on 26 November 2010, will be hosted by the Faculty of Physical Culture at Palacký University in Olomouc, Czech Republic. Back-to-back, the 2<sup>nd</sup> HEPA Europe conference will be organized on 24-25 November, in association with the 6<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Movement and Health. The main focus will be on the relation between physical activity and the physical, transport, social and cultural environment.

The call for expressions of interest to host the 2011 annual meeting was finalized.

#### 4. Update on recent, relevant activities and developments

An update was given on the ongoing activities at the international level, including:

- · activities of the WHO
- activities of the EU
- other international activities

Participants also debriefed on past meetings and conferences attended and informed on forthcoming meetings and events.

#### 6. Other business and next meetings of the Steering Committee

The members of the working group on Steering Committee arrangements met again in advance of the Steering Committee meeting. Changes to the Terms of Reference where discussed, including the selection and election procedure of the chairperson and reviewing the distribution of roles and work among the member of the Committee. Until the next meeting, the final version of changes in the Terms of Reference will be prepared, to be submitted to the network at the annual meeting. As informed at the 4<sup>th</sup> annual meeting, the current chairman, Brian Martin, will step down at the 5<sup>th</sup> annual meeting. The working group informed that Willem van Mechelen, Free University Medical School, Amsterdam, has agreed to be proposed as candidate for chairmanship of HEPA Europe. Professor van Mechelen will be proposed by the Steering Committee for election at the annual meeting of HEPA Europe.

The 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Steering Committee will take place on 16-17 September 2009 in Zurich, Switzerland.
