What is the eHiAP Flagship Course?

The WHO Europe eHiAP Flagship Course provides capacity building and tools for Member States to implement joint actions to improve health equity and wellbeing across sectors.

What challenges does eHiAP addresses?

- ✓ Leaving no one behind, tackling vulnerability and reducing health gaps are key priorities for all Member States and many partners in WHO European Region.
- ✓ Effective solutions require:
 - working with other sectors
 - engaging wider society
 - making health equity a priority for whole of government

The Flagship Course

- ✓ gives participants the knowledge and practical skills to improve intersectoral policy making.
- ✓ focuses on reducing health inequalities and tackling social and economic determinants.
- ✓ builds knowledge and skills in agenda setting, stakeholder analysis, negotiation, alliance building and advocacy across sectors.

Learning tools include case studies, best practices, evidence and different implementation models and approaches.

Learning style uses interactive techniques such as ted talks, simulations, role play and panel discussions.

Impact to date: 1/3 of all WHO European Region Member States have taken up the course and 15% of participating countries are actively implementing the learning to enhance intersectoral policy making for health equity.
