1994 –

WHO and the Government of the Kyrgyz Republic signed a basic agreement for cooperation

2002-2009 -

WHO Health Policy Project implemented to support the national health reform programmes

2003-2006 -

WHO malaria field office established in Osh in response to the malaria epidemic in 2002

2015 –

strengthened country presence with a larger team under leadership of WHO Representative



29 April 1992 –

Kyrgyzstan became member of WHO
