




European context for health





Lesson 1. Strengthening the health system



- Sufficient capacity in terms of personnel
- With adequate training and sufficient mandates and responsibilities allotted to them
- Explicit cross-government priority given to public health

Lesson 3. Enabling conditions



- ✓ Solid argumentation base for health
- ✓ Policy sectors involved have the capacity (mandate, skills and knowledge) to take action
- ✓ Sectors have developed a relationship on which to base planned action based on trust and respect
- ✓ Roles and responsibilities are clear
- ✓ Positive media coverage and public support
