- support for implementation of multidrug-resistant TB treatment strategy, 2017



HIV/AIDS

- evaluation of opioid substitution therapy programme, 2015
- support for HIV/AIDS vision paper and national programme drafting, 2016
- review of HIV/AIDS service delivery model, 2016
- assistance in reviewing HIV testing and treatment protocols, 2017



hepatitis

- review of the national hepatitis response, 2016 and 2017
- support for development of clinical protocol on treatment and prevention of viral hepatitis B, C and D and their complications, 2017
- contributing to the development of the national strategy on viral hepatitis 2017–2022

elimination of malaria in Kyrgyzstan certified by WHO in 2016



soil-transmitted helminthiasis

 support for elimination of soil-transmitted helminthiasis in Kyrgyzstan including deworming campaigns and prevalence surveys
