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What is Health 2020?

Health 2020 is a value-based action-oriented policy framework, adaptable to different realities in the countries of the WHO European Region.

Health 2020 is addressed to ministries of health but also aims to engage ministers and policymakers across government and stakeholders throughout society who can contribute to health and well-being.





Update on the ad-hoc working group

- At the November 2013 RCM meeting, WHO presented the *Review of* social determinants and the health divide in the WHO European Region
- Participants agreed to form an ad hoc working group on the social determinants of health (SDH), chaired by WHO
- The first videoconference was held on 30 April 2014 with the participation of 6 agencies (see below)
- Participants agreed:
 - to review the evidence and measures related to SDH to see how these can be useful for their own work
 - to identify opportunities for joint action, also with regards to the post 2015 process





Inter-agency work on SDH

- All 6 agencies reported being engaged in work on social determinants of health
- Agencies have adopted various methods for working on SDH that can complement each other: e.g. policy (WHO/the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP)), social protection (the International Labour Organization (ILO)), capacity development (the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA)), environment (the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE)
- 9 key studies inform work on SDH
- There is a need for interagency, multisectoral cooperation at the regional and country levels for effective work on SDH



Next steps

- There is a **clear link** between work on SDH and that for the prevention and control of noncommunicable diseases (NCDs).
- The NCD global monitoring framework includes 9 targets to whose achievement contributions are needed from the whole of society: primarily, the goal is to reduce premature mortality by 25% by 2025. In the WHO European Region, the greatest benefit will come from tobacco control, salt reduction, alcohol control and treatment of hypertension each of which in turn has its own target.
- The Sixty-seventh World Health Assembly (May 2014), approved the terms of reference for the global interagency task force on NCDs.



Interagency task force on NCDs

Objectives

- 1. Raise the priority of NCDs
- 2. Strengthen national capacity, leadership, governance, multisectoral action and partnerships to accelerate country response to NCDs
- 3. Reduce risk factors and underlying social determinants through creation of health-promoting environments
- 4. Strengthen and orient health systems
- 5. Promote and support national capacity for research and development
- 6. Monitor trends and determinants



Important link between NCDs and Health 2020

- Effectively and comprehensively addressing the prevention and control of NCDs requires a strong focus on intersectoral governance, SDH, human rights and gender, as well as a adopting life-course and people-centred approaches.
- Health 2020 provides strong political leverage and a coherent evidence-informed and value-based framework for addressing public health priorities such as NCDs, and integrating health in the social and sustainable-development agendas.
