Human papillomavirus (HPV) is a highly contagious infection that is transmitted through sexual or skin-to-skin contact.



The majority of men and women will acquire HPV at some time in their lives, though most infections are cleared by t<mark>he immune system</mark> within two years.

Persistent HPV infection causes cervical cancer in women and anogenital cance<mark>rs and warts in both sexes.</mark>

Vaccines are available that target HPV

HPV vaccines are close to 100% effective in preventing the persistent HPV infections that cause 70% of cervical cancer.



The most common side effects are mild and resolve after a short time. Serious reactions to the HPV vaccines are extremely rare.
